VOLCANIC STUDIES

In Many Lands.—Being reproductions of Photographs taken by the LATE TEMPEST ANDERSON, M.D., B.Sc. (Lond.). Second Series. The text by Prof. T. G. BONNEY, F.R.S., Sc.D. Crown 4to. 15s. net.

Contains the results of further visits to the Lipari Islands, Vesuvius (after the outburst in 1906), and to Etna, together with photographs taken after the great eruptions of the Soufrière in St. Vincent and Mont Pelé in Martinique, which occurred in 1902. Dr. Anderson again visited these islands in 1908 and obtained illustrations to show the return of vegetation and other changes. The present volume gives photographs of some Mexican volcanoes, taken in 1908, and of others from Guatemala, New Zealand, Matavanu, in the Samoan Islands, and Kilauea. It concludes with a selection from the photographs obtained by Dr. Anderson on his last journey—that to Java, Krakatau, and the Philippine Islands—so as to form with its predecessor an exceptionally large collection of Volcanic Studies from all parts of the globe.

In Many Lands.—Being reproductions of Photographs taken by the LATE TEMPEST ANDERSON, M.D., B.Sc. (Lond.). Second Series. The text by Prof. T. G. BONNEY, F.R.S., Sc.D. Crown 4to. 15s. net.
